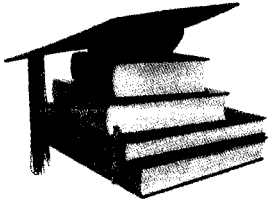

Rules Governing the Teamsters JC 10 New England Scholarship Award

1. Any Award made under these rules shall be known as a "Teamsters JC 10 New England Scholarship Award".
2. Only the following individuals shall be eligible for awards:
 - [a] Dependent children of eligible members.*
 - [b] Dependent children of deceased members provided, that the member was in continuous good standing, for twelve [12] consecutive months prior to and including the month of his/her death during the scholastic year the grant is awarded.*
 - 1) "Children" shall include stepchildren and legally adopted children.
 - 2) "Eligible Members" shall be defined as those members of the Local Union; Affiliated with Teamsters Joint Council 10 that have been in continuous good standing for at least twelve [12] consecutive months prior to and including the month of application.
 - 3) "Good standing" is defined as a member having his initiation fee, monthly dues, assessments and/or fines paid in full.
 - 4) Children of Officers, Business Agents, Organizers and Employees of Joint Council 10 and Locals affiliated with Joint Council 10 are not eligible to participate.
3. A minimum of one student from each Local Union that submits application, will receive an award.
4. Awards will be issued for students accepted and entering accredited Universities, Colleges and Junior Colleges.
5. Recipients must attend a college accredited by the Federation of Regional Accrediting Commissions of Higher Education. These institutions are listed in Accredited Institutions of Higher Education, published by the American Council of Education.
6. Only those students graduating from high school in the year the grant is awarded are eligible for year's grant.
7. If the recipient is unable to attend college due to a medically certified illness, the scholarship will be held in abeyance for not more than one [1] year.
8. All awards will be paid directly to the school in which the student is enrolled. Any unused monies from a grant shall be returned to Teamsters Joint Council 10 if for any reason the student withdraws from school during the year for which the grant was made.
9. Scholarship may be applied only towards legitimate school expenses such as tuition, room, board, books and miscellaneous expenses.
10. Applications must be submitted on forms furnished by the Scholarship Committee to your Local Union and must be returned to your Local Union for approval and then be received by Teamsters Joint Council 10 New England no later than April 20, 2012.
11. The grants will be awarded on the basis of a drawing at a Joint Council 10 Executive Board Meeting.
12. All decisions of the Scholarship Committee shall be final and binding.
13. All amendments to these rules shall be proposed by the Scholarship Committee of Teamsters Joint Council 10 and shall be effective upon approval of the Executive Board of Teamsters Joint Council 10.
